Comfortable rider, better ride



We always pack everything we need for our horses... but don't forget about yourself!

Always take a spare set of dry clothes to change into. The great British weather can throw all four seasons at us in one day, and it's not much fun having to drive home soaked through to the skin

A dry, warm rider is a happy rider!

WHAT TO RIDE IN

There's a huge choice when it comes to what you wear on your legs:

- Traditional breeches
- Lightweight riding tights
- Sports leggings

Sticky bum lover or hater – it's all down to personal preference. The key thing is comfort.

Whatever you choose, make sure you've tried them at home first. An endurance ride is not the place to discover something rubs, slips, or just doesn't feel right.

LAYERS LAYERS LAYERS

You'll likely ride in all weathers, sometimes in the same day!

- If you have a crew, you can swap layers in and out as needed
- If you don't, think about what you can comfortably carry with you

Also consider sunny days...It's easy to put sunscreen on at the start... and then forget to reapply. Instead, think about wearing lightweight long sleeves that you can roll up if needed.

FABRICS & FIT

Natural fibres often work best for comfort and breathability – but most importantly, wear what works for you.

Comfort doesn't have to mean expensive.

The best outfit is the one that:

- Keeps you comfortable
- Doesn't rub or restrict movement
- Works in all conditions
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At the end of the day, if you're comfortable, you'll enjoy your ride more – and that benefits both you and your horse
